

Message from the County Administrator

June, 2024

This message is a monthly update in 2024 to better inform our citizens and visitors to King William County. The information serves as a status report for ongoing projects, and also serves as a preview of different happenings that are in the planning stages.

County Government offices will be closed Wednesday, June 19 in observance of the Juneteenth holiday. Offices will reopen at 8:30 a.m. Thursday, June 20.

Real Estate tax payments are due on or before June 26 in the Office of the Treasurer to avoid interest and penalties.

Early voting this month for the June 18 Dual Party Primary Election will continue during normal business hours in the Office of the General Registrar. Saturday voting will be held June 8 from 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.; and June 15 from 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.

The Dual Primary Election will be held on June 18. Polls will be open from 6 a.m. – 7 p.m. at all voting precincts throughout the County.

The King William Farmers Market will be held Friday, June 7 and Friday, June 21 from 5-8 p.m. in the parking lot at King William High School.

The King William Business Roundtable will meet at 6 p.m. Wednesday, June 26 at the Parks & Recreation Center in Aylett.

The King William NAACP will host its 'Juneteenth Celebration' on Saturday, June 15 on the Courthouse Green adjacent to Route 30 beginning at 10 a.m.

- The Water Line Extension Project will continue to move forward this month. It is now 45 percent complete.
- Construction of the new water storage tank will get underway this month after a groundbreaking ceremony was held May 30.
- Financial tasks this month:
 1. Continue reconciliation transfer process with the Treasurer.
 2. Close-out of the FY '24 Budget year.
 3. Assist auditors with pre-work for the FY '24 Audit.
- Site plan approval is complete for the new WaWa's convenience store at the corner of Route 360 and Route 30.
- The Regional Department of Health reminds residents with septic systems they need to be pumped out at least once every five years.
